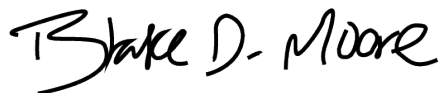
I am requesting funding for the Layton, Utah Pedestrian Overpass project in fiscal year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is Layton City Corporation. The funding would be used to construct a pedestrian overpass spanning a rail corridor that provides a safe and direction connection to the UTA FrontRunner Layton Station.

The investment in the Layton, Utah Pedestrian Overpass project represents a valuable use of taxpayer funds because it enhances public safety, strengthens regional transportation connectivity, and supports economic vitality in downtown Layton. The project eliminates dangerous at-grade crossings, encourages walking and transit use, and improves first-mile/last-mile access to transit options.
